- Develop Clinical Leadership: To build leadership skills necessary for managing teams and making critical decisions.

- **Improve Communication**: To enhance interactions with patients, families, and healthcare teams.
- Master Crisis Resource Management: To effectively manage acute clinical situations.
- **Strengthen Clinical Procedures**: To ensure proficiency in essential clinical techniques and procedures.
