This workshop will provide the doctors frameworks to deal with common acute presentations in various settings, i.e., Emergency department, Intensive care, Acute medical wards, GP practices including rural and remote settings.

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1. Domains-

2. Objectives-

- 1. Provide doctors with a practical approach towards emergency management in an interactive, hands-on, scenario-based workshop.
- 2. Diagnose and manage unwell patients in team-based environments as a leader following the principles of crisis resource management.
- 3. Provide doctors with a structured approach towards interpreting bedside and imaging investigations.
- 4. Communicate effectively with patients and colleagues in difficult situations.
- 5. Perform lifesaving procedures efficiently and promptly.
- 6. Advice around work-life balance and healthy living

3. Pre-Workshop learning-

Pre-Workshop learning will be provided to the candidates 30 days before the course; each component will have at least 4 to 5 hours of pre-reading material tailored to the workshop activity. For example, several examples of ECGs will be provided in the pre-course learning material, which will be discussed during the ECG session of the workshop.

An online quiz will be included with the pre-course learning, and successful completion of the quiz will be required to attend the workshop. During interactive sessions, the facilitators will encourage the candidates to participate in the discussion and attempt to provide their approach to clinical scenarios.

The Simulation scenarios will provide the candidates with opportunities to be part of the resuscitation situation as a team leader or a team member. In addition, facilitators will give them feedback after each simulation scenario and an opportunity to reflect and improve their practice in the future.

5. Context-

This workshop will provide the doctors' frameworks to deal with common acute presentations in various settings, i.e., Emergency departments, Intensive care, Acute medical wards, and rural and remote GP practices.

It will also benefit the doctors who are planning to step up and take on a more senior role in acute care settings. The workshop components are designed to provide the doctors with a structured approach in difficult situations while dealing with critically unwell patients to reduce their cognitive load. In addition, discussing the crisis resource management principles will be helpful in effectively leading a team in those situations. Finally, the workshop will allow the candidates to perform crucial and life-saving procedures on manikins, which will be particularly helpful for the rural GPs who often work as sole practitioners in remote locations.
